

Bored with your Board

I had a board that fell into the "I'll ride anything that floats" category and I have recently upgraded it to a Science Pipe. My oh my - what a difference! It's definitely faster and way easier to turn. So what should you look out for when buying a board? First it must be the correct size for you, see diagram on the right. If the board is too big, it will be difficult to hold the nose, while you are cutting back, doing 360s & aerials (never say never). If the board is too small, you are probably going to sink it. Shadows in the water now could mean one of two things: a kiter is in close proximity to riding over you or you have just past a sunken WOWee. The tail end of the board can either be a crescent or a bat tail (resembles bat wing) shape. If you are a prone rider (meaning you like to lie on your board to catch waves) and you like to do tight turns and spins, the bat tail shape is the one to have. However, if you want to carve, barrel and you want maximum hold on the wave then the crescent shape is best. So if you see a WOWee falling off a wave, chances are the board has the wrong tail! Channels also help the board grip to the wave and enhance speed, but again give less manoeuvrability. So it really is a choice of speed and hold versus spins and tricks. The stringer maintains stiffness in

the board and lengthens the lifespan of the core. (Stringer insertions might be the next brilliant idea for cosmetic surgeons). There are many boards that feature a lot more than this, but we will leave that to when we see the first WOWee take to the sky.

You have probably all read your sixty40 (check out the latest issue here) mag cover to cover and you have probably been having sleepless nights pondering over what the name of the mag means. Yes. Well, 60/40 refers to the proportions of the rails on the board. What? I have no idea, but we will get the low down on this when Ian Kruger, who is the Publisher & Managing Editor of Sixty40 and who also happens to be a hotshot bodyboarder, joins us in the water.
